Public Transport Security Committee Launches Safejourney.sg



From 23 June 2009, students need only visit one website, www.safejourney.sg, to access public transport security-related information. The website, the first such youth outreach portal in Singapore, is an initiative of the Public Transport Security Committee (PTSC).

"Each year, there are about 300,000 upper primary and lower secondary students. They are at an age where many begin to use public transport to get around. Safejourney.sg is a fun and exciting way to engage young Singaporeans to be active citizens as our eyes and ears on the ground, to help keep public transport safe," said Mr Jeremy Yap, Group Director (Vehicle and Transit Licensing) of Land Transport Authority (LTA).

He added, "Singapore's public transport network is fortunate to have remained free of terrorist attack. However, there are lessons and experiences that we can draw from other countries that have had to deal with major terrorist attacks in recent years. The website provides an excellent opportunity to share that experience to sensitise our youth and instill vigilance from a young age."
